ANIMATED IN POLAND is the presentation of Polish short animated films at the last stage of production. The representatives of the selected projects will talk about their films, before they are included in the programmes of film festivals in Poland and abroad. Each year international animated film industry professionals, such as festival programmers, distributors, sales agents and commissioning editors, participate in the pitching and one-on-one meetings afterwards. Before the pitching, its participants will take part in the pitch training that is combined with short project consultations.

ANIMATED IN POLAND TALENT MARKET is an unique opportunity for people from the animation industry, as well as for students and graduates of art schools who are about to launch their career. Creators looking for producers for their projects will have chance to meet representatives of 9 animation studios and present them their projects and portfolios. Talent Market is divided in two parts: presentation of animation studios and their newest productions, then with one-on-one meetings with participants who can show their work in progress projects and portfolio to the producers.

The partner of the event is Polish Animation Producers Association.

Talent Market is part of the Animated in Poland – the industry section of the Krakow Film Festival dedicated to the Polish animation industry.

DOC LAB POLAND is the biggest in Poland program for development, consultation, presentation and promotion of documentary films. The main program is divided into two parts: START, for 10-12 projects in development, and GO!, for 7-10 projects at the editing stage. The third important event is the CEDOC Market (Central European Documentary Co-production Market). It hosts ca. 30 additional producers every year. There are over 700 individual meetings organized every within the frame of the program. In March 2018 the program was awarded with the EDN Prize for outstanding contribution to the European documentary culture.

DOC LAB POLAND was created in 2015 by The Władysław Ślesicki Film Foundation, in association with the Krakow Film Festival. The foreign partners in 2021 are: DOK Leipzig and IDF (Institute of Documentary Film). Applications for workshops are open to Polish or Poland-based filmmakers while the CEDOC Market is also open for international producers, wishing to present their own film projects and seeking new ones.

The key events are DOCS TO START and DOCS TO GO! pitching sessions and CEDOC Market organized as a part of KFF Industry. They are addressed to international producers, distributors, representatives of institutions supporting film production, major film festival representatives broadcasters etc., who are looking for interesting projects to work with. DOCS TO GO! was initiated and co-organized by Polish Film Institute and Krakow Film Foundation at the Krakow Film Festival since 2012.

During the seven editions of the program over 170 projects were consulted at workshops and presented at pitchings. Out of them ca. 80 were produced so far. The other 200 projects from Poland and other countries were presented at CEDOC Market.

She runs Otter Films, Warsaw-based production company focused on art-house fiction and documentary films. Together with director Bartek Konopka she got an Oscar nomination for the documentary *Rabbit à la Berlin*. She produced or co-produced many documentary movies: 6 Degrees, Deep Love, Domino Effect, Art of Disappearing and Communion (European Film Award). Films produced by Anna won awards at Locarno IFF, Hot Docs, Krakow FF, Jihlava IDFF and Warsaw IFF. Feature film Zud by Marta Minorowicz had its premiere on Berlinale and Ayka by Sergey Dvortsevoy was nominated to Palme d'Or at Cannes FF.

SPECIAL EVENT!

B2B DOC LAUNCH PAD PITCHING

Launch Pad pitching is the B2B Doc flagship event, normally held in Kyiv, Ukraine. Even during the harsh pandemic period, B2B Doc managed to bring filmmakers and decision makers from the film industry to meet there in person, not just online.

After the Russian aggression against Ukraine escalated on February 24, it became clear that B2B Doc is forced to move its activities to a safe zone within EU. We are thankful to our colleagues at Krakow FF for finding an opportunity to integrate the B2B Doc Launch Pad pitching into the festival's industry programme, which is, as always, very extensive and productive.

This time B2B Doc will present 14 documentary film projects from Belarus, Ukraine, Moldova, Georgia, Armenia and Azerbaijan. They have all been developed in cooperation with B2B Doc's tutors for presentation to a panel of decision-makers. Most of them have never been pitched previously; for many of the filmmakers this will be a first serious meeting with the international documentary film market.

In every B2B Doc partner country there are either ongoing wars, occupied territories, or social conflicts. This situation is reflected in the topics chosen by the filmmakers. What will make the Launch Pad event in Krakow special is of course the war in Ukraine. B2B Doc will bring to Krakow Ukrainian filmmakers with highly topical stories, but distinctly different from what we see daily on the news.

There will also be new, dramatic human stories from Belarus, which should attract the attention of international commissioning editors and decision makers at the B2B Doc pitching. The Belarusian filmmakers



have unique, deeply touching working material under development, with the aim of making exclusive feature length documentaries.

There will also be new, promising documentary projects from the Caucasus - Georgia, Armenia, Azerbaijan; very intimate and personal stories, with close access to characters, powerful cinematographic language, a typical mixture of humour and pain. And again - every documentary is a distinct reflection of the times we all are living in.

To evaluate all these film projects, B2B Doc will bring to Krakow a strong panel of decision makers. Firstly, established producers from Europe, who are looking for co-production content. There will be also commissioning editors from various European TV channels, as well as film festival programmers, representatives of international film institutions and funds, distributors and sales agents looking for content from B2B Doc partner countries. B2B Doc has also invited impact producers and representatives from international NGOs, who can benefit from supporting these film projects and collaborate with the filmmakers, help them make social impact with their future films.

The B2B Doc Launch Pad pitching at Krakow FF aspires to be the most effective co-production industry event for content produced between the Baltic and the Black Sea.

In 2022, festival screened 80 films and attracted 70,000 viewers.

Doclisboa seeks to imagine reality through new cinematic forms of perception, reflection and action, placing filmmaking into dialogue with its his-

tory to question the present of cinema. Doclisboa is interested in films that are rigorous about their conceptual and formal implications; films that experiment with cinema's artistic and political possibilities and refuse to be categorized; films that engage with and mirror the complexity of the world.



Angeliki Petrou THESSALONIKI INTERNATIONAL DOCUMENTARY FESTIVAL GREECE

Thessaloniki Documentary Festival's main sections (International Competition, Newcomers International

Competition for first or second features and Film Forward International Competition, Open Horizons, NextGen, etc.) aim to inform, sensitize and mobilize the audience about critical issues. The festival's industry section, the Agora Doc Market (Docs in Progress, Thessaloniki Pitching Forum, Film Library, etc.), has established itself as a meeting point of film professionals from all over the world. Thessaloniki Documentary Festival is an Oscar Qualifying Festival.



Massimo Tria TRIESTE FILM FESTIVAL ITALY

The Trieste Film Festival is the only Italian festival focusing on Central and Eastern European cinema. Three competitive sections: feature films.

documentaries and short films, only Italian premieres. Industry Days: 'When East Meets West' co-production forum, with whom we co-organize 'Last Stop Trieste' (rough cuts of documentary films) and 'This is IT' (work-in-progress session of Italian feature films). Also: a showcase dedicated to independent Italian films, both documentaries and feature films seeking for distribution; masterclasses; meetings with film professionals; exhibitions; children's program; TSFF Academy, an educational program addressed to European Film Universities students.

A Hole in the Wall



Filmmaker Arjun Talwar observes the street he lives on. Through the eyes of an immigrant, he looks at today's Poland, encountering stories of migration, past and present.

The street of Wilcza in central Warsaw is just over a kilometer long, but within that space lies an entire universe: a police station, a squat, seven barbershops and a 19th century church. Arjun is an Indian filmmaker who has spent many years in Poland. But somehow, he still feels a distance between himself and the country. To find a deeper understanding of this estrangement, he turns his camera towards his neighbors - the old-timers, immigrants and drifters whose lives intersect on Wilcza. As he observes the rhythm of the street over the course of a year, Arjun discovers that it isn't just him who is looking for a place to be, a sense of belonging in a uncertain world. In fact, Wilcza is full of unfulfilled dreams and people living in limbos: between past and present, between an imagined homeland and a real one. As Poland has changed over the years, the street has changed with it. Bombed out backyards still display the wounds of WWII, while chic shops serve a new generation of rich Varsovians. When war erupts once more, in Ukraine, an apartment complex is transformed into housing for refugees, while many residents host refugee families in their homes. How will the inhabitants of Wilcza deal with this uncertain future? As his family asks him to return to India, Arjun feels compelled to stay and find a role for himself within this society. A Hole in the Wall is an intimate documentary film, that weaves together themes of loss, migration and contemporary European politics.



Diary of a Rebel - Krystian Lupa



As every Tuesday, Krystian Lupa gets on a train to Warsaw. The landscape passing outside the window blends with other images, transporting us into the world of this insightful artist and visionary.

A life on the move has been a norm for polish theatre director Krystian Lupa since his very childhood. Trains and aeroplanes are the places where he creates and learns. The film begins at a small station on the Polish-Czech border: the city where he was born, where he grew up and from where he soon started running away, as a remedy for domestic violence. At first, he would flee to 'Juskunia', a fantasy land of his own invention. Then, to Kraków and Łódź: to the Academy of Fine Arts, then the Film School and the Theatre School. His career, however, begins in Jelenia Góra. He is still searching for his identity - not only as a director, but also as a gay man. Soon, more stations are added to the list: Paris, Moscow, New York. He works in different languages. His shows create bridges between cultures; they are thought-provoking. Lupa experiments incessantly, trying to identify the mechanisms of ubiquitous, increasing violence. However, he never gives in to pessimism. In times of escalating crisis, where does the 78-year-old artist find faith in the future and a better tomorrow? This intimate portrait of Krystian Lupa will be composed of newly shot scenes from rehearsals, theatre shows, and the artist's everyday life, as well as archive footage from institutions such as the Institute of National Remembrance, and from Lupa's personal archives. An honest, almost private relationship with the film's director, will slowly reveal Krystian Lupa as he has never been seen before.

23-year-old Weronika has had enough of working as a model. However, in order to earn money for her studies and move to Warsaw she decides to take a contract in Tokyo. Her 13-year-old sister Hania, fascinated by Japan, also wants to go there and – to Weronika's despair – become a model. During their separation, due to the time difference, the only way of communication between the sisters is through voice recordings. In the huge Tokyo, thousands of miles away from home, Weronika meets other models, some of them her sister's age. Together they must meet the demands of adult life. Despite 12-hour work days and gruelling sessions, they experience friendships and first crushes. Weronika confronts the world of fashion, trying to understand if the sacrifices she made were worth it. The film will be a story about the subtle relationship between the sisters, the everyday reality of the fashion world and the accelerated maturation process. It will show young girls growing up, trying, stumbling, failing and living it all alone, far from home. We want to show the real life of models, so that they are not perceived only as thoughtless 'hangers-on' or just beautiful lucky girls.

Insurance against Meteorites



Since her brother died in a mysterious car accident, Natalia grew up under the weight of her mother's obsession with his unresolved death. 20 years later, as a filmmaker, she searches for the truth.

Natalia, the director, returns to her family home in the Polish village of Psary to reconnect with her misunderstood mother Wanda, a 65-year-old matriarch. In 2002 Wanda's 24-years-old son Bartek died in a mysterious car crash, and was deemed guilty. Since then Natalia, her sister Zuza and their father Henryk lived under the weight of Wanda's guest for justice to prove him innocent. Disturbing mistakes were made in the handling of the accident that signalled corruption. Meanwhile, the surviving driver of the other car turned out to be an ex-policeman and a son of a prosecutor. Natalia sees how Wanda's years of unsuccessful legal battles keep the family in a state of frozen mourning, 20 years after the accident she asks Wanda to perform her version of the truth. In her home office Wanda recites a PowerPoint presentation with 14 slides listing her accusations about the police, prosecutors, forensic medics and villagers' gossip. To find answers to these slides. Natalia and her co-director Jorik leave no stone unturned: from interviewing witnesses and document analysis by forensic car crash experts, to seances with a fortune-teller who predicted Bartek's death in 2002. The factual investigation quickly turns into a ghostly tale on the relativity of truth and conspiracy, and most importantly, a daughter's bittersweet love letter to her mother. While Natalia brings her findings home and dares to challenge Wanda's story for the first time, their relationship starts shifting.

He lives at his own pace, which might be seen a bit phlegmatic from the outside, but it is mainly due to his sensitivity and his careful observation of the world. Paweł's passion is boxing. He came to trainings basically by accident – it was one of the 'activities' suggested by the caregivers in the orphanage. It quickly turned out that he had both the conditions and a talent for sports. He has a large reach of his arms, speed and impact force go hand in hand with composure and conscientiousness. This story begins as a sport film to become a moral story about becoming a man who will be able to lead his life 'on his own terms'. The next fights resulting from the contract will give Paweł the answer whether boxing is really his destiny. How will he cope with further studies and whether he will be ready to leave the orphanage.

A story about people who, as a result of mourning, experience a radical life transformation. Anja – a certified mourning companion – helps them go through the difficult time of losing a loved one.

Tenderness of Transience is a story about the transformation process of three protagonists: Joanna, Katarzyna and Szymon, who go through various stages of mourning. In these challenging times, they are helped by Anja Franczak, who is the first certified 'companion in mourning' in Poland. She has exceptional skills in therapeutic work with people who seek support after the loss of a loved one. Seven years ago, Anja lost her child, and the process of recovering from the grief caused a dramatic change in her life. She has certified, writes a blog, and records podcasts, where she promotes a more sensitive approach to death and mourning. The camera will look at both the therapy with Anja and the everyday life of the three protagonists. The main idea is to create a story based on an observational camera about the universal human experience of mourning that can turn our personal world upside down. It becomes the beginning of the end for some people, but for many, it is a new opening, often very revolutionary. This is what happens in the lives of the film's three protagonists. The loss and the process of coming out of mourning and working with Anja caused very radical changes in their lives. The camera accompanies them through the various stages of their transformation to see what will happen to them.

Towards the Sun



Kasia and Robert, the parents of three boys, make a decision to sell their house, quit their jobs, and with a camper van start a journey of thier life, that would bring them closer to each other.

The transformative change in lives of the protagonists, let us have a closer look at deeper relationships in their family. Traveling in the camper van with very limited space inside, the protagonists begin to doubt the rightness of their decisions, while missing their old home, where they can no longer return. They live through moments of happiness and fulfillment, but also of friction and conflict in their family. The real challenge is the growing up of the boys who are held hostage by their parents' decisions. Each family member is changing through out the journey, which becomes the destination in eachself, as they don't have a set point on the map. Changing horizon is the background to the emotions that accompany the family. The film speaks about the closeness with others we so desperately need, which at times might lead to denial of personal freedom. Every decision has consequences and has its price. What is the lesson to be learned in order to stay together? Crisis in the family and the marriage is the essential part of the transition they are going through. Faces of Agata



Agata was about to die a long time ago. But instead - she was born again. The story of a woman who loves life, struggles with a lethal disease, makes art and keeps asking questions.

The film tells the story of a London based artist Agata di Masternak. Born in a little village in Poland, in a family with an alcoholic and abusive father, Agata has suffered violence and fear as a child. She used to pray for something that would take her away. When she was 16 she started to bleed heavily with a nose. Soon she was diagnosed with cavernous hemangioma of the jaw and cheek. The sentence: no more than three years of life. Balancing between life and death and trying to survive Agata has discovered the power of creativity: 'Painting saved me. I was born again then, I got out of the tube of paint.' – she wrote in her diary. Today, 37 years old Agata is an emerging artist obsessively fascinated by human face and focused on topics of trauma and survival. She has undergone dozens of operations, experienced severe pain and isolation. Her look was constantly changing due to the disease and surgeries, and this has been an extreme challenge for her sense of wholeness and identity. But somehow Agata remained full of vital energy and far from giving up. Where does her strength come from? Even though the protagonist faces the threat of life, the film is a story of a personal and spiritual growth, bringing hope and light.

Fear Out of Head



Where to find hope in the dark times? The director uses the computer screen as a window to the world and people who teach him that every fear can be overcome as long as we stay together.

Paradoxically, it occurs that isolation triggers contact, which may sometimes be surprisingly direct, even via the Internet. Intimate and sincere words uttered in the documentary indicate that every cloud has a silver lining. There is always hope and even those who seem most vulnerable manage to remain brave. The film comprises several micro portraits of diverse characters. These are people of different ages, occupations and backgrounds. The project, although overall not too heavy in reception, contains emotional testimonies of people influenced by the pandemic. The conversation between the director and the other person reveals the psychological aftermath of the daunting situation. The director becomes the character himself as the people he talks to start to ask him questions and give him advice. Pandemic turns out to be the right time to reflect on our place in life and ask the most important questions. Often, the verbal communication is the best medicine for anxiety, but only if we open up to each other. As long as we stay together, we will succeed to conquer our fears.

Hasan's Joy



How to remain calm in the face of impending cataclysm? The answer is 'keyf' - the Middle Eastern art of taking pleasure in being 'here and now'.

The entire city of Hasankeyf went under water due to the construction of the dam at Ilisu on the Tigris River, ending the 10 000-year history of settlement. Two kilometers away, New Hasankeyf, an estate of identical houses, was built. The most important monuments were moved. Many ordinary buildings had to be demolished to create space for transport, even before the city was flooded. The flooded city becomes an attraction for underwater sightseeing, and the castle protruding above the surface becomes a destination for noisy tourist ships. The scale of the changes could overwhelm Westerners, but the people of Hasankeyf managed to maintain their dignity and peace. The 'keyf' in the name of the city is 'pleasure' in Turkish. It can be derived from ordinary activities: walking or drinking tea. It allows you to push problems that you are helpless against into the subconscious. These events are described through the perspective of various people, but most of the scenes focus on Rengin - a high school graduate who stubbornly wants to enter medical studies, even though she has to improve her marks. and on Burak - barber working with his brother and deaf-mute father in saloon at the main bazaar. To emphasize the theme of inevitability and mythical doom, the story will start from the end. Opening shots present the ruins of the underwater city, then the taming of the new city, demolition and moving. The final scenes will be an idyllic image of the old Hasankeyf, which no longer exists.

Signs of Mr. Plum



Against will of his parents, a one-eyed boy became a graphic designer. He filled communist Poland with his logos. Many of them stay in use to this day, but no one knows that Mr. Plum created them.

Recognized, shortly before his death, as one of the eight most outstanding logo designers in the world, Karol Śliwka ('śliwka' – Polish word for 'plum') graduated from an art school although his parents wanted him to be a farmer. Even when he lost his eye, as a 12-year-old boy, he didn't give up his dreams of being an artist. Most of his logos were created anonymously – during his times trademarks were not considered art. Many people still have no idea that since the 50's, one man filled Polish streets, homes and institutions with his logos. He was present in our lives more than any other artist. This is the story of cosmetics labels, record covers, shoe brands, chocolate packaging, and postage stamps that every kid wanted to have. And behind each of them, there is the story of Mr. Plum. But also the story about changing Poland, a country in Central Europe that has undergone a revolution – from destruction during II World War, through communism, political transformation during the 90's, till the XXI century. And this revolution was marked by the signs of Mr. Plum. Tracking them down as if bits of memories, we look at Poland through his only eye.



15-year-old boxer, Łukasz Perkowski, grew up in a housing project in Warsaw, Poland. He comes from a multi-child family. His dream is to become the Polish Junior Champion. In order to achieve his goal, he informs his mom that he leaves for the best sports school in Poland, located 570 km away from home, at such a young age. Initially, his mom objects to that idea. Finally, she agrees. We observe the young man who puts all his eggs in one basket. We catch the moment when a child leaves home, and most probably will not return. He turns pro at a young age. We follow him with our camera for three years. The intensity of training makes Łukasz struggle with health problems. Due to COVID, he is forced to train individually. An injury sidelines him from various competitions, which are supposed to prepare him to achieve his life goal. His first attempt at the title ends with a defeat in the final. That takes a mental toll. He can always count on the support of his mom, who sees that her son is becoming more and more distant with every passing month. On top of that, a new woman comes into his life... She is new both from him and his mom. Łukasz has one last chance to become a champion.

25 year old Olivia confronts with the family tradition: following her mother she starts working by sorting minings's waste in one of the heaviest departments of the coalmine.

Young woman, Olivia, faces her future. Her mother Danuta leads her to the coalmine. Danuta works hard physically, when her husband privileged to get an early retirement as an underground miner, stays at home. It comes out, that Olivia works in one the hardest departments. She enters the industrial hell, where she is taught to shovel the coal's pulp, to clean the machines as well as select scrap from the belt. So now, she shares life path with her mother. When the sunlight, coming through the holes of the rusty walls, seems to get dirty from the mine's dust, a girl haves' conversation with her mum. Danuta assures frightened daughter: it all seems to be overwhelming, but she will get used to it. The phrase 'one can get used to it' becomes the mantra of the family, repeated on every occasion when Olivia wants to quit. Surrounded by a father - a former minter, by the mother - dedicated to the job and the boyfriend seeing mining as the best life choice, she decides to keep that job. When Olivia's four sisters meet by the bonfire, they regret not having a dreamed job. But they all defend the mother's choice, except one sister, Isa, who, as an awarded hairdresser, argues with them. Isa hires one of the youngest sisters -Alicia. But soon Alicia quits and applies to the mine. Even though the environmental issues make the proud family tradition a relic of former epoch, Alicia becomes part of the mining generation. Maybe the last one.



As Long as I Live



On the escape from traumatic past, Dalibor hides in nomadic circus. Fascinated by the magic of circus artistry, he finds his own creative way that helps to overcome his inner pain.

23-year-old Romani Dalibor's seen and survived more than any of us can even imagine. Feature documentary As Long as I Live tells a story of his desire to break out from the vicious circle of his past and become a proper member of our society. We'll watch a young man from marginalized community try to gain better control of his life and help make his family whole again. When he was eighteen, his abusive father threw him of of his house and Dalibor became homeless. When a wandering horror circus arrived in his hometown, Dalibor kept coming there every day, begging for a job. After initial refusals, the circus director was persuaded by Dalibor's perserverance and hired him as a manual worker. He also gave him a place to live and thus got Dalibor off the streets he gave him a chance no one else did. After some time, Dalibor began learning how to spit fire and control the pain when shot by stun gun. The circus director promised him if he trains hard, he'd eventually gets to perform and will earn more money. Therefore, Dalibor could provide financial support for his mother and younger brothers who now live in a shelter for victims of domestic violence. It seemed Dalibor found a new life goal, but his plans were temporarily paused. His past catched up on him and Dalibor was sentenced for a petty theft from when he was homeless. Despite that, his will to be better is not diminished by the jailtime. Quite the opposite - the vision of working and performing in the circus again seems to be one of few things to keep him sane and determined to grow.

Beyond the Red Light



The first openly trans sex worker in North Macedonia fights for acceptance, stability, and the decriminalisation of sex work.

Beyond the Red Light (BTRL) follows a year in the life of Lila, currently the face of transgender rights and the only open trans sex worker in North Macedonia. A recurring face on the national news, unwelcome by much of the conservative population, Lila also has a provocative side. Besides her very public image, Lila works for Star, the first sex workers' collective for the whole region of the Balkans. After receiving a grant from the Red Umbrella Fund, their mission is to decriminalise sex work in North Macedonia by December 2022. Lila and the rest of Star have seen first-hand the effects the current legal system has on their community. Most nights Lila goes to 'the strip', the open sex work scene where the risks take on new meaning. As Lila returns to sex work full time. The Ministry of Health unexpectedly cuts the promised funding for HIV prevention and outreach work by 40%, leaving Star with no income. Just days later, Lila's Gender Recognition Bill is rejected in parliament. Both events are catastrophic. and Lila watches as all the political and social progress she and Borche have spent years cultivating crumbles in a matter of days. No one at Star has been paid for weeks. After months of sex work, Lila has saved nearly enough money to fund her gender reassignment surgery, but she feels conflicted about whether to spend the money on herself or help her community. She deliberates whether prioritising her surgery is selfish. Star's dream to see sex work decriminalised by December is not guaranteed, but they always knew this would be a long and arduous fight - the struggle of a lifetime.

Do Painters Die Elseways?



Bolek is an 80 year old painter, facing childless death, surrounded by creation. His 60 year old, self-built house slowly turns back into a garden. In the meantime, Bolek moves out into the albums, where he summarises the run of his life.

The main character is Bolesław Gasiński, an 85 year old capist painter, who died in 2020. The film is not intended for biographical values. Bolek as a character is an example, the topic of this story is: death in the life of an author and life enchanted in creation. Bolek appears in Izabelin in the 1990s, proposes acts to married women, occasionally sleeps in the chapel of the 'Little Brothers of Jesus' and in the evenings often prays with the local taylor who does his laundry. He's lived here since the 60s, but no one has noticed him. His work has been exhibited in Europe, Canada, Japan, Australia and the Arab Emirates, and he now runs his gallery in a local tailor's workshop. When his girlfriend Eva gets cancer, Bolek records an audio diary for her, so she can 'laugh when it's all over'. She dies and Bolek keeps recording. From this tragical point, we develop a deeper background; a fatherless childhood in a village, being raised by paralyzed mother, who's working as a taylor, and her sister Adela; the german occupation, the deportation of the local priest to a death camp and the oppositional cabaret career in the 60's, which led Bolek to Warsaw. At the same time we combine biographical motives with the features of Bolko's art: religious paintings with an admixture of Bolko's own symbolism; ready-made wooden roots sculptures that now adorn his tomb; finally the self-built house, reflecting Bolko's character over 60 years. The house is a medium between art and live, it symbolises Bolko's identity enchanted in the matter. In the end of the movie the interior inertia is revived with pictural forms of Bolko's imaginary, displayed from his 8 mm tape animation.

Female Priests



The documentary deals with women in the Catholic Church striving to get an opportunity to be ordained to the priesthood.

We will follow the general female movement as well as individual stories of women in the documentary. It is a global phenomenon so the film will not be restricted to a single region. Women striving to become priests come from Canada, the USA, the UK, Germany, Switzerland, and Austria. There are several women who have been ordained to the priesthood illegally, by bishops who supported them. However, the Vatican has never recognized their priesthood, and the agile bishops were suspended at that. Still, the women continue their activities, meet, preach, write theological books, get ordination from other brave bishops who are suspended in turn - and all of them are excommunicated from the church as a result, but they never give up, and they have even got to the point that one of the women is a bishop who ordains other women to the priesthood. The Vatican ignores their activities, they are not allowed to get a legal status, their letters and calls remain unanswered. These women are not partners for discussion for the clergy. Still, they do what they want, and they exert gentle pressure to achieve a slow change. The documentary will research the stance of several women from various countries in the world, their strategy of thinking, their approach to the change in the Catholic Church, their life philosophy, personal beliefs, courage for rebellion, and also radicality with which they want to push for their desire to come true. Their internal dynamics differs a lot - based on the region, temperament, and the degree of conservatism in their country. The documentary will follow women of various ages, from 19 to 90 years, from various countries - Germany, Switzerland, USA, Canada.

Flowers of Ukraine



Natalia has lived on her Kyiv plot surrounded by nature since she was born. She is the last one to not surrender to developers, and as a result, her tiny house is wrapped by blocks. When the war breaks out, Natalia stays home to fight for Ukraine.

Mrs. Natalia is 67 years old. She lives on a plot of land in Kyiv where she was born, gave birth to her children and where she wishes to spend the rest of her days. She is fighting developers who are erecting a massive housing estate of multi-story blocks around the site of a village. Natalia, like the last Mohican, refuses to let corporations build on her piece of land. She opposes the construction of an underground parking garage on the site of her home. She is not afraid to run among the bulldozers that frequently enter her neighborhood trying to threaten her. Her plot looks like a mess, with the entire infrastructure resembling a temporary shelter for homeless people. It is, however, a paradise on earth for Natalia. She raises animals, including chickens and goats, and grows beautiful flowers here. It is a kind of oasis of peace, independence, and, most importantly, freedom for the people who live in her 'kingdom'. Natalia's children, who have been scattered around the world for a long time, try to persuade her to sell the land and live peacefully in an apartment in Kyiv, but she isn't interested. When the war breaks out, Natalia does not leave her land defending not only her territory but also her city. She also decides to join the Kyiv Civil Defense. Her history is a metaphor for the Ukrainian nation's strength and resistance. The woman is not going to sit around and wait for Kviv to be liberated; instead, she works in her own way, making Molotov cocktails among other things. Despite the odds, Natalia is upbeat, laughs a lot, and cracks jokes. Can war, however, change that? What is the fate of her 'kingdom'?

Galina has a husband the same age as her son, they have been together for 25 years. Galina's husband, Robert, also works in a circus. Galina addicted him to the magical world of circus fanfare. They have a joint number – Rolls. The heroine assists her husband. This woman is not going to go on a well-deserved rest, she is not afraid of the tragic consequences associated with height. She keeps flying, flying until her last breath!

House of Ants



House of Ants is a documentary portrait of relationship between a mother and her 14-year-old son who repeatedly oversteps her boundaries, bringing home species after species – ants, cockroaches, spiders, scorpions, and snakes.

Kasia, an aesthete, who surrounds herself with beautiful objects, values a life of order and harmony. Her 14-year-old son Oskar, on the other hand, is passionate about insects, collects and sells ants and runs a channel about them on YouTube. The son's interest becomes the axis of discord between them. To her horror, more and more living creatures appear in the house - scorpions and spiders are added to the collection. dreams of a snake appear. The mother's daily peace is disturbed by ants running around the flat having escaped from a broken test tube, dead mice hidden in the freezer, disgusting worms living behind her bedroom wall and the constant uncertainty of what else her son might be hiding in his room. Will the mother draw the line and interrupt her son's passion, will she allow him to pursue his interests at the expense of her own peace of mind? Will she risk damaging their relationship or give in to it completely out of a sense of maternal duty? A mother accompanies her growing son with a camera in her hand. Her attempts to overcome disgust and fear at times bring them closer together, at other times they become maternal overzealousness which her son cannot stand. The film documents the tense relationship between mother and son, clashing and reaching out for agreement, learning from each other to respect and accept individual choices. In turn, the biggest lesson turns out to be how not to sacrifice and give up on oneself in the name of parental love. The story is accompanied by a wildlife film style narration focused on the anthill and the rules that govern it. The way ants build their community and their queen becomes a humorous analogy to the human world.

Isabella



Isabella Flore knows she will die at the age of 93. She has only two years left to save herself and her decaying town from oblivion. Nevertheless, her sense of humor, her verve, and her indefatigable character does not leave her.

Isabella Flore is 91 years old and has an explosive temperament. She is a deeply religious Catholic and a fortune teller. In the past, she was a victim of domestic violence and a brave mother of a severely disabled daughter. Today she is the only inhabitant of a Sardinian village next to what was once the world's largest river dam. The opening of the dam was celebrated by the Italian king himself, and shortly afterward by Mussolini. Today, the dam is in danger of collapse and the village stands abandoned. She is often visited by people who have found themselves at a turning point in their lives. Isabella predicts betrayals and new romances to desperate lovers. She helps businessmen avoid financial problems. She predicts the recovery of a terminally ill woman and the birth of a child. However, whoever arrives expecting a quiet old woman quickly blinks their eyes in astonishment. Isabella is despotic. She loses patience easily and shouts loudly, her 'visions' are rounded off with a surprising sense of humor. But despite her strong character, Isabella grows weaker. When the guests leave, she is left alone. In silence, she puts on her oxygen mask. She breathes heavily, Isabella has one dream. Before she dies, she wants to renovate the abandoned buildings and the church. She often talks to God about it and crosses out successive lottery tickets. However, she cannot predict the one winning number. So she writes letters to the authorities asking them to do something. She does not have much time left. According to her own prediction, she will die in 2 years. She does everything to save the memory of the village and of herself.

Just Hear Me Out



After 3 years in a psychiatric hospital, Gosia, an 18-year-old diagnosed with a full-blown drug-resistant schizophrenia returns home. Will she find refuge in a society that brutally rejects disparity?

This feature-length documentary tells the story of children and young people affected by mental illness. We will describe their daily lives at home and in hospital; we will depict their traumatic moments and those when the desire to live prevails over the illness. The 18-year-old protagonist Gosia Eismont has struggled with full-blown drug-resistant schizophrenia since the age of 12. She has experienced states of deep psychosis, manic and depressive episodes, and suicide attempts. Her disease will never go into remission; Gosia had to learn that visual and auditory hallucinations were now constant elements of her life. In the past three years Gosia stayed in the Institute of Psychiatry and Neurology in Warsaw and then in Hostel - the Psychiatric Rehabilitation Centre in Otwock. In June 2021 she returned home and we have accompanied her in her daily life since. We are at her therapy sessions with a psychiatrist and when she meets her friends from school and hospital, even as they experience their psychiatric crises; two of them had suicide attempt recently. We also observe how Gosia spends time at Przystan Club (Polish for 'refuge'), a centre for people with chronic mental illness; most of them in their fifties. Can Gosia cope with everyday life, with own emotions? Will the voices in her head gain control again, will they stop suggesting suicide? Finally, will the world around her, where mental illness is cruelly stigmatised, allow her to be happy?

Love Generals



A Burmese activist was sentenced to death, when his plan to assassinate Chief of intelligence was disclosed, in 1988. After 20 years in prison he left for active exile, where he remained till now. After coup d'etat in 2021 he is fighting again...

B., a Burmese student activist was sentenced to death, when his realistic plan to assassinate most powerful man of military junta was disclosed, in 1988. A devoted buddhist decided to sacrifice his soul for the people. His case was never made public by militaries, probably of the fear, that his idea could be followed by some others. Eventually, he spent in harsh prison for 20 years. First ten years he was in a cell containment alone, he lost many of his teeth of beating and he survived on deep meditations. In the end he survived as the only one from his group. During prison he went through many spiritual experiences and visions, which helped him to survive - only 2 of 11 friends' activists survived. While second decade in prison, his close relatives smuggled a small dismantled camera in for him under threat of severe penalties. B. assembled the camera and made several hundred photographs that. once seen by high UN representatives, shattered the position of the junta's leading generals several years later in terms of existence and conditions of political prisoners. Authorities succeeded to identify him as its author, which made him again an object of rage. At that time he has been already in exile, where he remains till today, since 2010 in Czech Republic. After the coup he remained one of secret ambassadors pro-democratic forces and I follow him...

Matylda



A growing group of women are dissatisfied with their Polish partners who do not meet their expectations. They dream about handsome foreigners. We follow the story of Matylda, who enters into a romantic relationship with a black man from Africa.

There is a growing portion of Polish women who are dissatisfied with the status quo - of 'God, Honour, and Fatherland' mentality. They reject the traditional rules that lock them within the boundaries of the kitchen and bringing up children. They are actively seeking something more: adventure, freedom and romance beyond what their conservative culture can offer. They are pursuing their dreams. Matylda, a certified translator who speaks several languages, lives in Warsaw. She experienced a turbulent marriage with an African immigrant, Kevin, which brought to life her first daughter Lea. She saved her future husband from deportation, but their relationship did not stand the test of time. Matylda got acquainted with another black Congolese. Michael is 37 year old musician, romantic and full of charm, so different from the banal, bourgeois Kevin. A holiday in Mozambique allowed the couple to meet in real life. Matylda helped the new partner come to Poland. After an adventurous journey he arrived in Warsaw in October 2019. They are living together and Matylda bore a new child - Rita. The future may bring many surprises. If their marriage survives the test of time, they will probably one day finally leave the country to realize the dream of travelling, gaining new experiences, and the fullness of life that freedom of choice gives. Many mixed race couples fail the test. The clash of cultures, the difficulties that everyday life brings - all this destroys unusual relationships. In the background - racism. A white woman and Congolese man... What will their life be like? How will they overcome cultural differences? We will tell you about it in our observational film.

Moscow Nights



In the 1980s, uniquely in history, the leaders of the superpowers supported by their wives, had the vision and courage to end a dangerous 40-year conflict by doing the unthinkable: talking to the enemy and building trust by personal, human contact.

This film takes an archival vérité look at the meetings between the superpower leaders Mikhail Gorbachev, Ronald Reagan and George Bush between 1987 and 1991, taking us to the heart of a dramatic political moment as the fate of the world is decided. The recent events in Europe have their roots in these decisions. Taking into account the latest historical research, this film uses the power of research and original sources, in the form of film archives, many newly discovered and newly digitized. Through the cumulative effect of selecting and editing the archives in order, back to back, a new story emerges in front of our eyes on the screen, allowing the audience to make the connections for themselves and giving them a glimpse of what really happened during those momentous events. How would it feel to be a fly on the wall during these events? Through the observational footage filmed at the time we can still feel the excitement and tension of those moments. As the filmmaker rewinds and replays the familiar events, a new narrative emerges, one which reinserts the women, who wield enormous soft power, back into the narrative. We see real friendship developing between the superpower leaders and their wives, because we see and read peoples' expressions. body language as well as their spoken words. We see what happened before and after the famous news-bites. Our interest is in the human story; how individuals can change history by building trust and friendship with their former adversaries. The Cold War ended through collaboration, not the victory of one side. It took a great leap of faith that almost achieved the impossible. We must not forget.

Mothership



An in-development documentary essay about the different forms of abuse experienced by a teenage girl who grew up in a Romanian small town.

Nava Mamă (Mothership) is an essay film about the different forms of abuse experienced by Mara (b. 1991), a girl who grew up in Buzău, a town in the south-eastern region of Romania. The film consists of three video letters created by Mara for one of her online friends that she's never met in person. In the first letter, through postcard-like images, she uses her voice to guide the viewer around the places in her hometown that she still has vivid memories of. The second letter addresses Mara's childhood spent in the secluded village of her maternal grandparents, in the company of her fearful grandmother and abusive grandfather. The third letter, by far the most complex, invites us into the confusing and conflicting microcosm of her teenage years. What begins as a playful description of the geography of a place slowly descends into a visceral recollection of traumatic events. By blending the sense of intimacy of the epistolar form, austere urbex images, and raw Direct Cinema footage, Mara shares these episodes with us.

Radio Power



When the conservative Polish government censors a legendary national radio station, generations of loyal listeners band together to fight for the station they love.

It is a story about the power of the radio, the fight for freedom of speech and thought, and how, despite censorship in Polish national media, people united to save their beloved radio hosts and recreate the radio station they had worshipped. After nearly sixty years of existence as Poland's unique, avant-garde radio station – the journalists of 'Trójka' were recently unjustly dismissed, one after another, by a the government afraid of libertarian influence and western music. The voices of the radio hosts, who had been the first to play foreign hits from smuggled vinyl records in the communist era, receded back into the shadows. The alleged influence of the radio management on the weekly charts sparked a scandal in 2020, which resulted in a bitter public outcry. Millions of people were deprived of their music gurus, who had decided to leave for good. However, loyal listeners refused to give up and gathered together to finance firstly one and then another radio – New World and 357. With this, generations brought up surrounded by the sounds of 'Trójka' radio, did not lose their window to the outside world – but did the Polish nation lose something on the way? And is the fight for a free media really over or is it just the beginning?

His work is characterized by a balanced pace, breathing space, the aesthetics of the image, and credibility.

Before joining Passion Pictures in 2019, Misia had produced several fiction shorts and docs. Her passion for true, intimate stories,

psychology, and quality storytelling has led her to gain vast experience in the production of high-end feature documentaries for both cinema release and online platform streaming. At Passion, she got to work on Emmy-winning *Rising Phoenix* (2020), highly-acclaimed *The Real Charlie Chaplin* (2021) and Bafta-nominated *The Rescue* (2021). She is now focusing on gaining more editorial experience and becoming a feature documentary producer.

PASSION PICTURES (UNITED KINGDOM) is supporting Misia Pawłowska's work only in a creative and mentorship way. At this stage, Passion Pictures isn't able to support the production in a financial or any other way that would allow getting the project off the ground, although they supported early development and funded the production of the sizzle reel. Passion Pictures would be happy for the project to find a new production company that has more experience in producing documentaries in Poland.

Searching for Lotika



Mysterious widow Lotika, the first businesswoman in the Balkans and one of the most memorable characters in Nobel laureate Ivo Andrić's famous novel The Bridge on the Drina. This is a road movie about finding Lotika's truth from Tarnow to Israel.

Jelena Đurović from Belgrade is entrusted by her mother, Svetlana, with an unusual task. She has to go to Višegrad and visit the grave of Svetlana's great-grandaunt, Lotika Zellermeier, and find a rabbi who would say Kaddish (a prayer for the dead) that Lotika never had. The reason is that Svetlana saw that someone had named his enterprise and tavern 'Lotika' after this woman, and this frustrates her. The mention of this tavern reminds Svetlana of an oath that she has failed to fulfil - namely, her great-grandaunt was not buried after the established Jewish customs and she has no gravestone. She decides to transfer this oath to her daughter Jelena and thus somewhat appease her conscience. Lotika Zellermeier is in fact one of the most memorable characters in Ivo Andric's famous novel The Bridge on the Drina. The mother asks her daughter to erect the gravestone, but also to find out as much as she can about Lotika and her destiny since this is her 'dving wish' (Syetlana is a kind of a mother who pretends to be dving. thus blackmailing her family, which adds comedic overtones to this relationship). It is important to highlight that, except from being a character in a novel by a Nobel laureate, Lotika was also one of the first women to run their own private business in the Balkans she was the owner of a Višegrad hotel. The film is a road movie - Jelena embarks on a journey which starts in Belgrade in the Ivo Andrić Museum, and continues in Tarnow. a town in Poland, Lotika's place of origin, where her family still has living descendants. From Tarnow she moves on to Sarajevo, then to Zagreb and Israel, in her attempts to complete the puzzle. Finally, she reaches Višegrad.

The Confession of a Mole



A mole, the metaphor of the conflict between traditions and modern Chinese female's self-consciousness. When the unexpected cancer comes, will she find the answer of this self-searching journey?

Mo, Filmer and the filmed, may appear as a silly curator of joy, yet she is an emotionally fragile 'relationship killer' in reality. Never has any of her relationships lasted longer than half a year. At the age of 30, Mo is still single. After seven years' staying in Poland, Mo will spend her first Chinese New Year home. Her mother suggests that she has her mole removed, because in the Chinese traditional physiognomy, a mole under the eyes means bad luck on intimate relationships. Upon receiving her mother's advice, Mo starts to think: 'Is it really this mole that blocked my way into love?'. Her grandpa pays a visit, but in fact to urge her to get married. Under intense pressure, Mo tries to explore the reasons why she has stayed single for so many years. In Berlin, she meets a man she once had a crush on and asks him why they didn't end up together; getting caught up in confusion and being lost, a new love comes to Mo. Hui, who is a documentary filmmaker with a weak stomach and frequent hiccups, is six years younger than Mo. In the early stage of their relationship, Hui still has feelings for his ex, which brings great torment to Mo. Will this love ever last? After breaking up, Mo exhausted and tormented, comes back home to visit her parents. After some days' observation, Mo realizes that the recurrent patterns between her and her ex can be found right in the relationship of the parents. The unexpected breast cancer gives Mo a wake-up call. Mo notices that all the problems she has is not only about the relationships, but also what kind of way she chooses to live. And slowly, she learns how to survive in the world that fills her with love and pain at the same time.

The Guest



When the law does not protect people anymore, you must take action on your own.

Polish-Belarusian borderland 'zone'. Outside the house the area is heavily patrolled by army and police and inside an intimate drama is developing - drama of newborn friendship. Two peers, Syrian and Polish in their 30, and mother of the Polish one. All the three are trapped in brutal reality. Syrian man risks his life to get to Europe. But in Syria he'd be drafted into the Bashar Assad Army (he doesn't want to kill people). Polish guy and his mum are in danger to go to jail for helping the 'illegal immigrant'. They host him but in fact they hide him. Syrian man is recovering after being hunted. In the jungle (as he calls the Polish forest), after illegally crossing the border, push backed for 5 times, he spent long time hidden inside the old tree. First he heard his fear - voices of the soldiers looking out for him, but later he stayed only with the song of winter birds. He was like and animal fighting to survive and now he finds a temporal home. This gives him a strength for the further journey. In everyday life Polish guy and his mum are in passive aggressive ups and downs but now they have to pull themselves together. The Syrian stranger in need evokes the healing of the relation between them. During 10 days full of tension and dramatic efforts to find the safe solution for their new inmate they go back to the roots of the family - to the solidarity. These material has been shot in conspiracy; in paranoic fears of the borderland zone where none is sure any more what is legal? Where is the border between hospitality and smuggling? Still for our heroes one thing is unquestionable - when the law does not protect people anymore, you must take action on your own.

The Legacy



The Legacy explores the consequences of chemical warfare in Vietnam and its cultural impact 50 years afterwards. The film follows last living perpetrators of the tragedy who have for the first time agreed to speak in front of the camera.

For the first time in years the threat of using chemical weapons has once again become a reality. In the wake of today's events, the making of the The Legacy has for us become all the more a critical and urgent matter. The film examines far reaching consequences of chemical warfare. It is estimated that in Vietnam alone 4.8 million victims have been affected by exposure to Agent Orange - a substance causing inconceivable birth defects, disabilities and body mutations. In the film, the director shows her path of uncovering this multi-layered psychological context of chemical warfare. Hoan spent her childhood in a hospital ward in Ho Chi Minh City dedicated to children victims of Agent Orange. She was the first patient to graduate from a university, despite the fact that she was born without two legs and an arm. Today Hoan weighs whether she's going to have a baby given the likelihood that it will be born with heavy birth defects. Americans Heather and Josh are the children of Vietnam veterans. Their fathers' wartime exposure to the chemical affected their offspring with the same birth defects as those endured by the victims in Vietnam. Just like their Asian peers they face a lifetime of limitations and pain. Pilots who sprayed the poisonous chemicals during the war - Dewey and Steven - didn't speak openly about their past for decades. This is the first time that the two pilots agree to speak in front of the camera. What they did in the past caused unspeakable suffering and destruction, however - aren't they also victims, serving as pawns in the hands of their prominent military career architects? Internally divided, living in denial, but still victims.

Within a transitional society, an old part of the city is trying to adapt and survive. Guided by a young boy and his dog, we observe its transformation, gentrification and hear a poem about the city, the country, the region, the world.

While his father builds and repairs river boats in his workshop in the Chinese quarter, Northern Serbia, Andrej (10) and his dog China (12) roam around and explore this unique neighborhood. They know everybody and everybody knows them. For Andrej, and China, this place is home. The boy hears bad news around the quarter: all the workshops will be demolished, all the craftsmen evicted and something new and unknown shall replace them. The locals, including Andrej's father, are getting organized in attempt to stop this. Andrej and China find themselves in the middle of the conflict between Goliath (the authorities and investors) and David (the locals).

The Stepmother



Antónia, a Hungarian stepmother, raises 4 Chinese children in her home as a full time job. While being a real mum for the kids until they turn 12 she needs to prepare them for the separation and teach their estranged parents on how to live with them.

In the outskirts of Budapest lives Antónia (60), a Hungarian midwife, who has been raising the children of Chinese parents for the last 10 years as a fulltime job. The Chinese families employ her because they work hard in Chinese restaurants in Hungary and have no time to take care of their kids. Currently Antónia raises four children in her home to whom she gave Hungarian names: Viki (3), Pipi (5), Lili (6) and Pisti (7). They have been living with her since they were four weeks old. Antónia teaches them everything. She takes them to school, comforts them when they are sad and gives them motherly love. Since the parents visit them only during weekends the children are strongly attached to Antónia and call her mum while losing the Chinese language and culture and gradually becoming alienated from their parents. The film follows how Antónia raises the 4 children in her home and how they develop a strong bond between each other. Antónia is there during the most crucial years of their lives, but when they become 12 their parents take them back, so they can start helping in the family business. Separation is a traumatic experience for the children and Antónia as well. In the film I follow the kids with intimate observational camera until they move back to their real families and adjust to the new culture. I also follow the process of separation and how Antónia prepares the parents to take back their role in the life of their kids. Showing the parallel worlds of the Chinese parents working while Antónia cares for their children, I intend to express the universal fate of migrant families and the sacrifices they have to take in order to secure a better life for their children.

A divorced middle-aged man who is eagerly dealing with organizing his life, meanwhile he finds it hardly possible to escape from the loneliness.

A middle-aged man, Peter, lives in a remote house overlooking the city of Budapest. He lives alone in his untidy, silent place as the house leaks after heavy rain, and he hardly stops it. He next arranges an unsuccessful online date as the other side does not show up, and later attends a public event but fails to communicate effectively or appears to be odd. Peter's children do not appear in his place even though he plans to have them. As a result, he remains socially isolated in his fairly big, remote house until an online guest, Hanna, via Couch Surfing - a website through which Peter accepts travelers to sleep at his place for free - requests to stay for a day and night. Peter confirms it. He manages to pick her up on the day she arrives. She is a beautiful young girl, and he seems so excited when trying to introduce her to the building and its view towards the distanced city. The presence of Hanna brings some changes to his lonely life, similar to his distanced behavior as it tangibly breaks the house's isolation. Hanna leaves tomorrow. They both exit the place as Peter takes her with his car to the city. He then comes back to his house, which is now isolated again. Therefore, the day after, Peter decides to call his son to invite him there, while he sounds to indirectly turn him down.

Waiting for Miracle



Some people do miracles, others have to prove them. Most people just believe or disbelieve them. Where do you belong? Authentic witness statements in the 'true miracle story' of the contemporary Catholic Church.

The beatification processes are fascinating because of the supernatural phenomenon of miracle meets austere legal logic, the harsh church bureaucracy and the precise and demanding rules of investigating miraculous healings. You could almost say that the greatest miracle is when a 'servant of God' passes this procedure. Especially in comparison with Poles, Czechs are not very successful in their efforts to bless or canonize their 'servants of God'. As one of many examples the only Czech buried alongside the popes in Rome, Cardinal Josef Beran, should be declared a saint. In order to become one, he must perform a miracle after his death. A special church commission collects evidence and assesses its credibility. So far, several supposed miracles have been declared unreliable. The trial is now in its final stages, and the Vatican-appointed 'devil's advocate' will not miss a thing. Saints have been an integral part of the world's oldest existing institution for two millennia. But what about their miracles in today's secularized age, when the Czech Catholic Church loses 3% of believers a year and is most discussed in connection with restitutions and pedophile affairs? And what about faith and the church as such today? Will Catholics become a marginal sect, or will they retain their centuries-old social influence? And what is the comparison of the most atheistic country in Europe with its Catholic neighbors? At least in recent years, they have performed more miracles and won many new saints, but is their faith stronger and the church better functioning? A film by practicing Catholic director Vít Zapletal about the crisis of his home church.

Wajda is a documentary focusing on the international successes and artistic influence of the Polish Master of the cinema - Andrzej Wajda.

The documentary film Wajda will focus on the international successes and artistic influence of the Polish master of cinema, Andrzej Wajda. From the time he received the Silver Palm for the film Kanal at the Cannes festival in 1957 until his award from the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences for his lifetime achievement Honorary Oscar in 2000. Kanał and Ashes and Diamonds have become the most important cinematic triumphs of 'the Polish Film School' (one of the creators), thus opening the door of Polish cinema to the world as one of the most recognizable Polish filmmakers. In our documentary, we want to find out what kind of Poland foreigners saw in his films. The film will be based on the testimonies of many outstanding filmmakers and film critics - e.g. Martin Scorsese, Nikita Michałkow, Volker Schlöndorff, and his wife memories Krystyna Zachwatowicz, an exceptional woman, wife, and artist, one of the closest people in Wajda's life, often, an anonymous collaborator for the world outside! We want to get the archival materials of Waida, photos from the sets, his participation in international festivals, and his journal notes from these events, recently discovered new archival material. is a multidimensional film, showing a filmmaker's career in constant conflict with the authorities and the opportunities he has been given. From the battle for his autonomy in creativity to living under immeasurable stress and pressure from within his country and often abroad. Andrzei Waida used to say: 'a film director must be both a poet and a corpora'. Both of these features perfectly reflect the nature of his work. We shall explore it to the fullest in the film.

'What the... Hen!'



A giant biomechanic hen puppet is being created in the Podlasie region, in order to block the construction of a chicken farm. The designer of the doll is Łukasz Puczko. The unconventional protest form unites the residents of the village of Solniki.

The idyllic vibe of the village of Solniki is threatened by the construction of a giant poultry farm with chicken coops covering a total area of 4 hectares and the annual production capacity of 3.5 mln chickens. Unless the local community succeeds in blocking the investment, it will result in environmental damage and the residents. The members of the community establish an NGO, come up with a petition and file numerous complaints with various authorities. The 32-year-old Łukasz Puczko decides to build a 2-meter tall hen, a biomechanical hybrid which will be animated from inside by an actor. The residents want to use the giant hen to draw attention from the media. The hope for saving the village grows stronger and the project unites even the biggest skeptics. The investors have secured support from powerful lawyers and got huge financial backing. They already built a farm in the nearby village of Kuriany, which has caused stench, diseases and contaminated water. The unexpected outbreak of a war in Ukraine interrupts the design of the hen. Łukasz gets busy helping the refugees. He invites Maria and her two children to live with him. They quickly become friends. The residents keep pressing Łukasz to complete the design. The investors haven't been idle. After their initial plan for 12 chicken coops had been rejected they filed another one for 6 hen houses. The residents are very committed. What's at stake is the well-being of a vibrant community. Not to mention the preservation of a unique ecosystem which is located exactly on the site of the future poultry farm. They plan to hold events in Białystok, Warsaw, etc. Will the hen stop the investors?

You Have to Go, the Others Stay



The film centers on the topics of mourning and death, suppressed in modern culture. I intend to convey it through so called 'dinner of death', a meeting of random people who share the experience of loss. My goal is to depict new funerary traditions.

The film You Have to Go, the Others Stay is to be centered on death, loss and the need for inventing new traditions to help overcome grief. It will feature a group of people, whose personal experience will serve as a point of departure for describing the world of lack after the death of a loved one. At the basic level, the film will feature meetings, so called dinners of death. This initiative brings together strangers who all experienced loss, discussing the topic of death at the dinner table. Free of social convention, their conversations are full of grief, anger and laughter, giving a new perspective on bereavement. Our guides in this world will be Anja Franczak, the only licensed death doula in Poland, and Justyna Bargielska, a charismatic writer who came up with the initiative after experiencing loss herself. On a deeper level the film conveys the need for constructing new funerary traditions, as the previous ones have proven dated and ineffective. I would like to show these new rituals as psychological tools that the protagonists use to survive the loss of a loved one. The structure and narrative are intended to follow the group process, without resorting to interviews. On a third level the film aims to show the burial ceremony as a ritual that requires transformation. Our guide in the world of funerary rites will be Jan Möller, founder of the Center for Funerary Culture and Education in Berlin, a pioneer in discourse of death. I wish to create a multi-faceted film portraying the process of reclaiming the subject of death in modern culture.
